



The Service of Compline from Ascension Day until the Feast of Pentecost

Welcome to Compline in this period of expectance and excitement between Ascension Day and the Pentecost, often thought of as the 'birthday' of the Christian Church.

'Compline' is the ancient 'office' with which monastic communities end their day of prayer. The word 'Compline' comes from the Latin 'Completorium' which means completion, so the day is complete when this time of prayer is offered. It is how the first Bishop of Norwich, Herbert de Losinga, and his community would have ended their day as Compline is derived from the Rule of St Benedict which the community followed. In community it is the beginning of the 'Greater Silence'; after praying Compline, the community would be silent until the next day began to dawn and their prayer together began again.

To help translate this worship to Zoom, the Bishop of Norwich will welcome us each evening and light a candle. An officiant will then lead us through the service and our corporate responses will be led by the person who will read to us from the scriptures. Our own microphones are muted but please do join in with everything in bold with other members of your household too as we pray together
