Holy Communion in Creationtide If you are a visitor to this church, a very warm welcome to you! This church hopes that today you will feel at home and part of the family.

If you have children with you, at the back of the church there is an area set aside for the under eights with things for them to do. Alternatively, there are activity bags available for your child to have with him or her as they sit with you. Please don't worry about whether or not your child makes a sound – most service leaders can make more noise if they need to! We are delighted that your child is with us. As toilet arrangements are different in each of our churches, please ask the person who gave you this booklet—they will be happy to tell you where the nearest toilet is.

During the service, like Christians around the world, the story of our faith will be celebrated; that in becoming one with humanity, Jesus made sacred the ordinary events and activities of life. In Creation Season we also celebrate God's creation—the seasons through which we live and work, God's goodness in providing the food we eat, and perhaps take for granted, the gifts we have been given, life that surrounds us and of which we are a part.

On the night before Jesus died, in an upper room in Jerusalem, he shared a final meal with his friends and explained that he would soon die and that whenever we eat bread or drink wine we should remember that his death was for us so that we would be forgiven our sins and live fully. Through the Holy Spirit, we believe that God uses the bread and wine to feed those who come to him in faith. After the meal, Jesus also washed the disciples' feet to show them that all his followers must love and serve other people in the same way that he loves us. These two aspects of Jesus' life are remembered every time we meet, and in particular when we share in Holy Communion together.

But Holy Communion is more than a reminder, as wine is poured and bread is broken, our own life experience of struggle and suffering is given hope and meaning that we can live by. Because Jesus offered his vulnerability and love to the world in obedience to God's love for the world, so we do too in such a way that it becomes the means of new life to us all.

The nature of that new life can be glimpsed as we share peace, a meal and worship God together 2

Now that the Service has come to an end, we hope that you will join everyone else for a cup of tea or coffee and a chat.

A minister uses this or a seasonal invitation to confession

Yet always, in the midst of this creation glory, we see sin's shadow and feel death's darkness: around us, the abuse of matter in the earth, sea and sky, beside us, the betrayal of one another, in the broken, the hungry and the poor; and often, deep within us, a striving against your Spirit

God has blessed us, but still God's children go hungry: Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.** God has blessed us, but still the poor cry out for justice: Christ, have mercy. God has blessed us but still we see inequality and oppression in the earth: Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.** 

#### Amen.

# Prayer after Communion

Silence is kept.

Father of all, we give you thanks and praise, that when we were still far off you met us in your Son and brought us home. Dying and living, he declared your love, gave us grace, and opened the gate of glory. May we who share Christ's body live his risen life; we who drink his cup bring life to others; we whom the Spirit lights give light to the world. Keep us firm in the hope you have set before us, so we and all your children shall be free, and the whole earth live to praise your name; through Christ our Lord. Amen

### **Blessing**

The minister may use seasonal blessing:

May God the Father, who clothes the lilies of the fields and feeds the birds of the air, provide us with all we need for life in all its fullness.

May God the Son, who fed the five thousand and turned water into wine, feed us with his life and transform us in his love

May God the Holy Spirit, who hovered over the waters of creation and formed the world from chaos, form us in the likeness of Christ and renew the face of the earth. Great is the mystery of life Christ has died Christ is risen Christ will come again

### **The Lord's Prayer**

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.

### Breaking of the Bread

The minister breaks the consecrated bread

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

### **Giving of Communion**

The minister says this or another invitation to communion.

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which He gave for you and His blood which He shed for you. Eat and Drink in remembrance that he died for you and feed on Him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving. **Amen.** 

The minister and people receive communion. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please come forward to the communion rail, kneel and simply bow your head and hold yo<sup>1</sup>? hands by your side. After receiving the bread and the wine reply:

God our Father, we are sorry for the times when we have used your gifts carelessly and acted ungratefully. Father in your mercy **Forgive us and help us** 

We enjoy the fruits of the harvest, but sometimes forget that you have given them to us Father in your mercy **Forgive us and help us** 

We belong to a people who are full and satisfied, but ignore the cry of the hungry Father in your mercy **Forgive us and help us** 

We are thoughtless and do not care enough for the world you have made Father in your mercy Forgive us and help us

We store up goods for ourselves alone, as if there were no God and no heaven. Father in your mercy **Forgive us and help us.** *The minister says:* May God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son to be our Saviour forgive us our sins and make us holy to serve him in the world, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen** 

#### **Gloria in Excelsis** *The Gloria in Excelsis may be used and is sometimes sung.*

2. Glory to God! Our hearts to you we raise! Joy and peace on earth, in highest heaven praise! Songs of adoration, Lord to you we bring, Praising your great goodness Father, heavenly King. Glory to God, Our hearts to you we raise! Joy and peace on earth, in highest heaven praise!

#### The minister recalls the Last Supper

We praise and bless you, loving Father through Jesus Christ our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son. On the night before he died he had supper with his friends, and taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: drink this all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, as we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

#### These prayers may be said at the preparation of the table.

As the grain once scattered in the fields and the grapes once dispersed on the hillside are now reunited on this table in bread and wine, so, Lord, may your whole Church soon be gathered together from the corners of the earth into your kingdom. **Amen** 

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation: through your goodness we have this bread to set before you, which earth has given and human hands have made. It will become for us the bread of life. **Blessed be God for ever.** 

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation: through your goodness we have this wine to set before you, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become for us the cup of salvation. **Blessed be God for ever.** 

### **The Eucharistic Prayer**

The Lord is here. **His Spirit is with us.** 

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The minister praises God for his mighty acts using these seasonal words and all respond

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Holy Father, Almighty and Eternal God. 10 For you have created the heavens and the earth, and formed us in your own image. In the fullness of time you sent forth your Son, your eternal Word, who laid down his life for our salvation

## **The Collect**

Creator God, You made the goodness of the land, the riches of the sea and the rhythms of the seasons; as we thank you for the harvest, may we cherish and respect this planet and its peoples, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

# The Liturgy of the Word

**Readings** *At the end the reader may say:* 

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.** 

A **hymn** may be sung. We remain standing after the hymn. **Gospel Reading** When the Gospel is announced the reader says:

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N* Glory to you, O Lord.

#### at the end:

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

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### **The Creed**

#### We stand to say the Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting. Amen.

### **Prayers of Intercession**

A member of the congregation may lead us in prayers which usually include these concerns and may follow this or another sequence:

The Church, it's leaders and ministry. The world and those in authority. Our local community. Those who are suffering in body, mind or spirit. The families and friends of those who have died.

This response or another may be used.

Lord, in your mercy Hear our prayer. Or Lord of the harvest In your mercy hear us

#### And at the end:

Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

# The Liturgy of the Sacrament

### The Peace (all stand)

The harvest of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control.

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

All may exchange a sign of peace by shaking hands at this point or sometimes at the end of the service. **Preparation of the Table**
