



RE Update April 2021

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Ofsted's plans to release Subject Research Reviews and Subject Reports

This will be based on their 3 phases of Curriculum Research:

- Phase One understand more about the current state of curricular thinking in schools.
- Phase Two curriculum design and aimed to raise standards through the curriculum.
- Phase Three move beyond just looking at curriculum intent to looking at how schools implemented that thinking and what outcomes it led to.

- Research reviews: these will collate currently available research evidence. We will consider what published research evidence tells us about a high-quality education in each subject
- Subject reports: we will inform leaders, teachers and tutors, parents and policymakers about what we have learned about the state of the nation when it comes to the quality of school curriculum in a range of subjects

Reminder RE curriculum (Phase 2): Quality factors

- the importance of RE as a subject with individual disciplines (3 lenses)
- using the RE curriculum to address disadvantage and provide equality of opportunity
- regular RE curriculum review
- using your RE curriculum as the progression model
- intelligent use of assessment in RE to inform curriculum design
- retrieval of core knowledge baked into the RE curriculum
- distributed curriculum leadership



As RE is not a National Curriculum subject it is unclear if Ofsted will include it when it publishes these reviews and reports later this year.

Even if it does not we will be able to glean evidence from other humanities subjects to reflect a view in RE.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND Following the announcement by the government on 29th March that routine Ofsted graded inspections will remain suspended until the Autumn term we can confirm that SIAMS Inspections will not resume until the Autumn term of 2021. We will be working with the Department for Education and the other section 48 providers to consider the most effective way of resuming SIAMS inspection and will be in touch with more details about this as we also introduce our new nationally integrated system for SIAMS.

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From September 2021 SIAMS:

- New national programme for SIAMS scheduling
- New national critical readers
- Inspectors will inspect in wider regional areas
- Training and schedule may adapt to take into context covid
