- 1) Do you think each piece of evidence is good evidence or not? Explain why.
- 2) What, if anything, could be wrong with each piece of evidence?
- 3) Can you order the evidence from best to worst?
- 4) How would you question each witness' statement?
- 5) Would any of the evidence be enough to convince you the man is guilty?

Witness 1: 'I had a dream that he did it.'

Witness 2: 'My friend's mother's hairdresser said he did it.'

Witness 3: 'I read that he did it in the newspaper.'

Witness 4: 'Everyone thinks he did it.'

Witness 5: 'I just feel deep down inside that he did it.'

Witness 6: 'His fingerprints match those on the door of the room the painting was in.'

Witness 7: 'I know that he had a motive to steal it.'

Witness 8: 'I saw him do it.'
