1. NPQs through the Diocese of Norwich

Headteachers and governors are always looking for good quality professional development opportunities for themselves or for staff at their schools. NPQs are nationally recognised qualifications and are, therefore, ideal for anyone wishing to further their career. This year all NPQ courses are being fully funded by the DfE - in fact, small schools will even receive £200 per successful participant.

The **Diocese of Norwich** has linked up with **St Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Multi Academy Trust** to offer a range of **NPQs** from **February 2023** as a delivery partner for the **Church of England Foundation for Educational Leadership** – NPQH, EHCO, NPQLTD, NPQLBC, NPQSL, NPQLTD.

- For new and aspiring headteachers, <u>the fully revamped NPQH</u> provides excellent training in how to ensure a culture of teacher excellence which improves outcomes for every single child, navigating the challenges which arise in a headteacher's role.
- For new headteachers in their first five years of headship, there is the <u>Early Headship Coaching</u> <u>Offer</u> (EHCO) – a comprehensive support offer for new headteachers who have already completed their NPQH or are embarking upon one now. This focuses around a 360 degree evaluation, which enables candidates to follow a tailored learning journey, and builds upon a Peer Support Network model.

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- For teachers who have, or are aspiring to have, responsibilities for leading teaching in a subject, year group, key stage or phase, there is the <u>Leading Teacher Development</u> course (NPQLTD).
- For teachers or support staff who have, or are aspiring to have, responsibilities for leading behaviour and / or supporting pupil wellbeing in their school there is the <u>Leading Behaviour</u> and <u>Culture</u> course (NPQLBC).
- For school leaders who are, or are aspiring to be, a senior leader with cross-school responsibilities National Professional Qualification for Senior Leaders (NPQSL)
- For teachers who have, or are aspiring to have, responsibilities for leading teaching in a subject, year group, key stage or phase - <u>National Professional Qualification for Leading</u> <u>Teaching (NPQLT)</u>

All the courses being offered contain a blend of face to face and online sessions with the former being hosted on the Norfolk / Suffolk border. A unique feature of the Church of England offer is that small group coaching is built in as part of the programme.

Diocesan School Days



This year the Diocesan Schools Cathedral Days are on 1 & 2 March 2023. The overarching focus is spirituality which reflects one of the strands of SIAMS as well as the focus for the Head Teacher Conference 2023. This year pupils will explore three workshops with a theme of The Psalms. Each workshop will be based on the following three strands:

Prayerful Working with the Norwich Cathedral Choir School to explore how the psalms are sung, how they offer words of prayer to God and how this can be for a range of reasons. It will include learning to sing psalms and as a result develop personal spirituality.

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Pastoral Focusing on spiritual reflection, using times taken from some of the most well- known psalms, pupils will explore the concept of the image of God, who God is and how they have a personal view of God.

5. Israel and Palestine Educational Workshops

Solutions Not Sides (SNS) is an organisation that explores courageous advocacy and living well together with a global dimension. It is also a good example of the lived experiences of people in Israel and Palestine – which is a valuable way to support teaching RE in our schools.

The Solutions Not Sides Youth Education Programme focuses on driving solutions focused discussion and encourages skills such as critical thinking. The programme is divided into three workshops:

PART 1. Exploration

The students engage with a short video, with Palestinians and Israelis talking about what the history of this region means to them (1 hour)

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Prophetic Undertaking active and physical learning, including parachute games! Pupils will explore the common concepts in the psalms of protection, peace and stewardship.

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PART 2. Empathy

They learn that pushing for a win-lose outcome will likely lead to lose-lose, and what that really means for the people affected (1 hour)

PART 3. Empowerment

They hear the personal stories of Palestinian and Israeli peace activists growing up in conflict and under occupation, and their choice to reject hatred and work together for justice and peace and undertake solutions-focused discussions (1.5-2 hours)

Parts 1 and 2 are delivered by teachers with guidance and materials from the SNS team, and Part 3 is delivered by one of their facilitators in person with Israeli and Palestinian peace activist speakers joining via video call directly from the region. The cost of the workshops vary depending on the needs of the school and can be negotiated with the SNS education team directly (usually ranges from $\pm 280 - \pm 550$).
