## Additional Matter Order No. 1/2023

Upon the representation of the Diocesan Advisory Committee of the Diocese of Norwich

In exercise of the power conferred by Section 78(1) of the Measure the Chancellor makes the following Order:

An authorised person may undertake any matter prescribed in the first column of the table in the Schedule without a Faculty subject to any conditions that are specified in relation to that matter in the corresponding place in the second column of the table;

Words and expressions used in this Order have the same meaning as they have in Part 3 of the Faculty Jurisidiction Rules 2015.

Contractual reservation of car parking spaces on church land within the jurisdiction of the Consistory Court (consecrated ground or curtilage)	<ol> <li>The renting out or hire of car parking space must be by an authorised person (by written contract that has previously been agreed by the Diocesan Advisory Committee – DAC) and in respect of consecrated ground or the curtilage of a church under the jurisdiction of the Consistory Court of the Diocese of Norwich;</li> <li>Any signage or advertisement of the facility placed upon the land in</li> </ol>
	question must have been agreed beforehand by the DAC, other than the exclusion notice in no.3 below;  3. The risk and responsibility for loss of, or theft from, the vehicle parked must be borne by the owner (or the owner's agents) and exclusion of liability on the part of the church and

- the Parochial Church Council (PCC) must be drawn clearly to the attention of any vehicle owner by signage;
- 4. Planning permission, if required, must be obtained prior to the commencement;
- The PCC must notify its insurers of the intention to enter into such an arrangement and ensure that appropriate public liability insurance cover (if needed) is in place;
- Nothing prevents an application for faculty permission if a proposal is not within the scope of this Order. Such application would then be decided by the Court in the ordinary way.

This Order shall take effect from the first day of the month following the date of this Order.
