Aim

To create an understanding of the needs for clean water in Papua New Guinea (PNG), especially at Newton Theological College.

Preparation and Materials

Visit Google Maps to locate <u>PNG</u> and its unique place in the Pacific Ocean Visit <u>Diocese</u> of <u>Norwich</u> website and <u>Bishop</u> Graham's Lent Appeal, The Water of Life

The Bishop's Lent Appeal 2024 will help to raise money to provide water tanks for Ordinand's Homes at Newton Theological College in Papua New Guinea.

Bishop Graham writes: "Your donations and fundraising will enable ordinands and their families to thrive, so supporting the next generation of Christian leaders in Papua New Guinea to have the best possible start with their training."

Most of the student houses at Newton College are in great need of refurbishment and nearly all need significant repair, but the primary need is to provide them with clean water from rainwater tanks and to reconnect toilets to septic tanks.

It will cost around PGK 2,000 (around £400) to install a water tank between every two student houses and the aim is to raise to raise enough to provide twenty-five tanks between fifty student homes.

Where is Papua New Guinea?

Travelling to Papua New Guinea would take approximately 30 hours by plane and is usually via Australia or Hong Kong.

Papua New Guinea is 0.6 degrees south of the equator. It is an Oceanic country with offshore islands in Melanesia in the South West Pacific Ocean.

It is one of the most culturally diverse countries in the world with 848 languages. Its 7 million

people live in mainly rural populations and in the few towns and cities.

The country is situated on the Pacific Ring of Fire and there are earthquakes and active volcanoes. It is surrounded by coral reefs and in the highlands, there are dense rainforest and a rugged terrain across the mountains, the highest of which is Mt Willhelm at 4,509 metres. Temperatures are as high as 20C during the day and fall to 8C degrees in the evening.

Newton Theological College is in Popondetta, Oro Province, and our Lent Appeal for Water of Life is focused here.

Water tanks are needed to ensure that student accommodation can have clean rainwater and sanitation. One tank is needed for two units of accommodation which houses the training incumbents and their families. The cost is approximately £400 for each tank.

What Can We Do?

- We want to help the families and those training for ministry.
- We want to help them to have clean water.
- We want to help Newton
 Theological College to offer a better style of accommodation to the students

How can we help?

There are many ways in which we can help.

- We can plan activities to raise money which will go to the Bishop's Lent Appeal

- We could find out about the colourful clothes people wear and what they eat.
