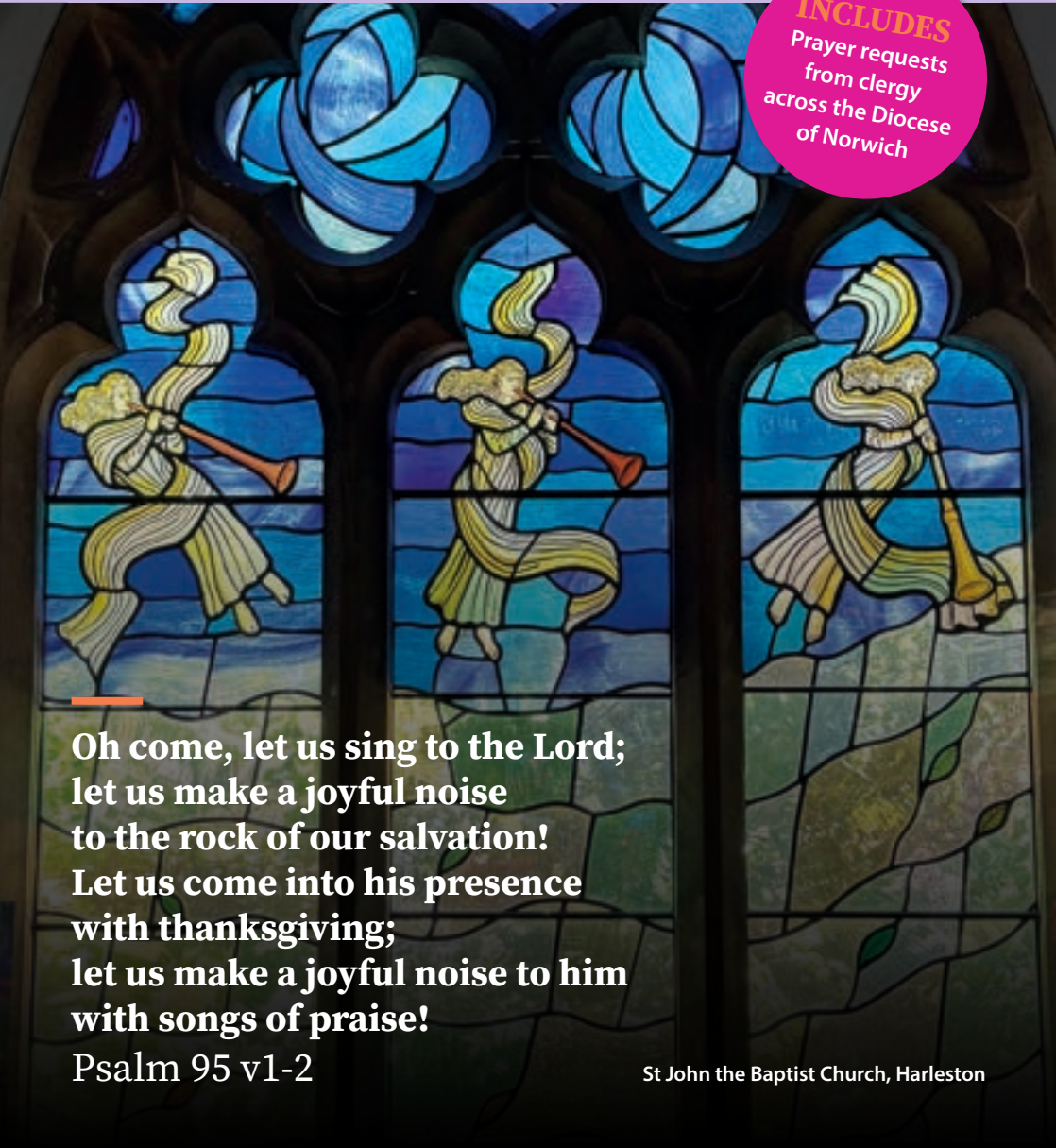

Foreword from **The Rt Revd Ian Bishop, the Bishop of Thetford**

I love singing. There is something special in the simple act of congregational worship that often takes me into a numinous experience. Wherever it is, whatever style it is, I love to be able to sing with others and feel the presence of God. A good old Wesleyan belter as part of a big congregation and I'm transported into the presence of Christ. It isn't because I'm musical, because I'm not, I am the only person I know who failed their Grade 1 piano exam, but I still love to sing.

Music is a universal language and regardless of whether it's the crowd at Anfield ringing out 'You'll never walk alone' or the infant school choir struggling through 'Away in a manger' or 'Do you hear the people sing' sung from the barricades in Les Misérables, music has the ability to stir you emotionally in a way words never can.

That's of course why music has always been at the heart of worship from the very earliest days. That's why I'm so grateful for the music groups, choirs, organists, guitarists and triangle players who stir us

week by week with music and who give so generously of their time to prepare and deliver something that lifts us into the heavenly realms. The gift of music is something that needs to be treasured because, at its best, it takes us to the heart of God.

AW Tozer once said that 'worship means to feel in the heart'. I think that's why we sing and make music in church – so that we feel the presence of God in an emotional way deep in our inner being. As I declare each week 'send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory' it is a call to take the experience of praise into the world. To bring the music of heaven into the silent emptiness of our communities, to let the praise of our Sunday merge into the Monday commute.

As you pray with us this summer I dare you to sing as you pray. St Augustine is attributed as having said, 'he who sings prays twice', so why not double your prayers and burst into song?

Meet Revd Deborah Walton – who once a month swaps hymn books and sermons for headphones and a sound-desk.

On most Sundays you can hear her at one of the coastal churches of the Flegg Parish Church Team Ministry. But on the third Sunday of each month you can tune into her radio show too.

“Revd Debs’ Sunday Service” is broadcast on Great Yarmouth community radio station Harbour Radio – reaching households throughout the area on FM radio (and across the world via online streaming.)

Her two-hour programme is a mix of sacred and secular music, a Bible reading and reflection, prayer, and conversation.

“I love it,” said Revd Debs, of Martham, “I love the process of putting the show together and broadcasting. I love communicating with others and there is a real sense of community with the listeners.

“I like finding new ways of sharing faith with people and this is lots of fun too.”



She was invited to join the Harbour Radio team after hearing about the station from one of her congregation. Although she had no presenting experience, her hidden talent for broadcasting was honed when lockdown restrictions took church services online.

AMP up the music

Action songs are top of the pops with the children of Attleborough.

St Mary's Church in Attleborough runs a music project including a children's choir called AMP Voices. Every term-time Tuesday after school, children meet to learn new songs, sing old favourites, make friends and have fun. St Mary's also has a church choir.

Attleborough Music Project (AMP) was launched to provide a centre of musical excellence for people across the town and nearby communities. It aims to help people play, sing and listen to music, enhancing skills and boosting well-being. Plans for the future include outreach work using the church and church hall, and restoring the church organ. The project has already run workshops for schoolchildren with the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment and the Britten Sinfonia.

AMP Voices is free, open to all primary school-aged children, and led by music outreach worker Tom Appleton, who has worked with St Paul's Cathedral and national youth music organisations.

The Gospel according to Jazz



On June 1st, the Norfolk Gospel & Jazz Collective will be playing at Fakenham Church, and on June 29th, they'll be at the Fountain of Life venue in Swaffham, with more churches to come. If you'd like to host them, just invite them!

The Collective recently played to a packed house at St Margaret's Church, Stratton Strawless, and led a 'SomerSunday' family service in Somerleyton on Remembrance Day. Their sound is a vibrant mix of Gospel, Jazz, Motown, Funk, and Soul – a fusion of faith and music that stirs the heart.

Some things are better said, explored, and imagined with music. I still remember my English teacher looking me in the eye and paraphrasing Shakespeare:

"The man that hath no music cannot be trusted."

He was drawing from The Merchant of Venice:

"The man that hath no music in himself, nor is not moved with concord of sweet sounds,

Is fit for treasons, stratagems,

and spoils;

The motions of his spirit are dull as night, and his affections dark as Erebus.

Let no such man be trusted. Mark the music."

In the Psalms, we see prayer expressed as an overflow of the soul – wrestling, praising, yearning, and burning with the things of God. Through the centuries, this cry has found voice in shofars and shawms, and later in soul, hip-hop, and horns.

Today, some of our music worship struggles to embrace depth and diversity. We know that The Gospel According to Jazz is just a drop in the ocean of what could be – a step toward a mixed ecology of worship in the church. It is, however, soul food for those who are longing for the story of God to be painted in more musical colour. Our prayer is that this drop in the ocean might be for someone, living water.

Stepping Bach

In early January 1996, David Dunnett had no inkling that his appointment as Norwich Cathedral's Master of Music and Organist was the beginning of a 29-year adventure.

Despite having “very fond memories” of a frantic first term, which included overseeing music for the Royal Maundy service, David maintains that a “cold November evensong can be equally rewarding” as a high-profile performance.

A decade into his time at the Cathedral, David successfully sought the Chapter's approval for a reorganisation that would see him relinquish the Master of Music title but continue with his professional and personal passion – playing the organ.

The ever-present challenge to “control the mighty monster” is what forged David's decades-long enjoyment of this craft. The instrument's “multi-tasking, techno side”, he adds, made for a suitable alternative to piloting aircraft – something he



thinks may well have suited him equally well.

Rather than flying at 30,000 feet, it has long been the soaring sounds of Bach which motivated David, and music will continue to form a major part of his life once he steps back from his Cathedral role upon retirement in August.

“I will always continue playing. I want to do more piano work, more jazz work and recitals. I'll always be doing musical things, and that's one of the joys as a musician – you never have to stop, even when you retire.”
