Early Bird Form

To support applications for NPQs, a new 'Early Bird form' has been launched on the website, https://www.nse.org.uk/npq.

The form is open for participants who wish to reserve their place on a course next year. At this stage they are not choosing a region or delivery partner, they're just choosing a course. Please do share this form and spread the word.

The message is very much that the National Society for Education has been oversubscribed and had to turn people away for the last two cohorts so schools who want the best chance of getting a scholarship place, should one be available, need to apply as soon as they can. We're hoping that, between us, we can get a good number of early applications in this way.

Once the DFE open the registration portal, central office will contact all those on the Early Bird list and prompt them to do the DFE registration form, and then the full CofE application as per the usual process.

Big Spring Sing

Knowing the part that singing plays in so many of our schools, you may be interested in the following opportunity (including many excellent free resources!).



Last year several Dioceses took part in 'Big Spring Sings' in various locations around the country. They were run by three different DBEs and between them involved several hundreds of pupils and many of their parents, enabling the pupils to celebrate their part in speaking up for justice and raising awareness of the work of Christian Aid, along with some fundraising. Easter sets the theological framing for these events with the ultimate celebration of the victory of life over death.

At this stage, in our Diocese, we haven't made any plans for a large-scale event where schools come together but would certainly look into this if there is enough interest!

It may be something that you would just like to do within your existing relationships with other schools e.g., across a Federation or just within your own school.
